CST is Community Security Trust, a charity that protects British Jews from antisemitism and related threats. CST is recognised by the Police and Government as a unique model of best practice.



Security

CST provides security advice and training for Jewish communal organisations, schools and synagogues. CST secures over 650 Jewish communal buildings and approximately 1,000 communal events every year.



Volunteers

There are more than 2,500 active CST security volunteers throughout the UK. They are the foundation of CST's work. Volunteers come from every part of the Jewish community.



Antisemitism

CST receives reports from victims of antisemitic hate crimes. CST's annual *Antisemitic Incidents Report* is recognised as the most authoritative study of antisemitic hate incidents in the UK.



Commercial guarding

CST manages a multi-million pound government grant for commercial security guards at hundreds of Jewish schools and other community buildings throughout the UK. This enables British Jews to afford the levels of guarding that they need.



Sharing expertise

CST provides expert advice on every aspect of antisemitism to the Police, the Government, politicians and media. CST runs the Communities' Security Programme to provide training and advice to other faith and minority groups.

Youth and students

CST supports the *Streetwise* and *Stand Up!* projects alongside *Maccabi GB*, that educate young people on safety, antisemitism and other forms of hate crime. CST helps to protect students on campuses in partnership with the Union of Jewish Students.



Security enhancement

Since 2006, CST has spent over £11 million on enhancing physical security measures at Jewish buildings across the UK to better protect them from terrorism. This includes fitting anti-shatter window film, access controls and CCTV systems.

Social media policy

CST provides expert advice to social media companies about antisemitic hate speech online. CST works with several international partners, including the European Commission, to counter online hate.
