

Joining forces against hate

It has felt like antisemitism has been in the news a lot this year. Whether it is the Labour Party's problems, social media trolls or a general rise in racist attacks, the subject has been front page news on a regular basis.

The first six months of 2016 saw an 11 per cent increase in antisemitic hate incidents recorded in the UK compared to the same period in 2015, according to CST's Antisemitic Incident Report January-June 2016. CST recorded 557 antisemitic incidents nationwide during the first half of 2016, compared to 500 antisemitic incidents during the first six months of 2015.

HOME AFFAIRS SELECT COMMITTEE INQUIRY INTO ANTISEMITISM



This month, the Home Affairs Committee inquiry into the rise of antisemitism held its third evidence session on antisemitism. Mark Gardner, CST Director of Communications gave evidence, alongside Sir Mick Davis, Chairman of the Jewish Leadership Council. Ephraim Mirvis, Chief Rabbi of the United Hebrew Congregations of the Commonwealth and John Mann MP, Chair of the all-Party Parliamentary Group against Antisemitism were also called upon to give evidence to the Committee. In previous weeks, the other witnesses were Ken Livingstone, leader of the Labour Party Jeremy Corbyn MP, Board of Deputies President Johnathan Arkush and Scottish National Party's Westminster leader Angus Robertson MP.
