Programming Analyst

Full time, based in London

As a Programming Analyst you will work closely with the 'Open Source Intelligence' hub (OSINT); a team which is part of the main Research Department within the organisation. The key focus of the role is to understand the OSINT challenges and to produce relevant creative technical solutions which will move the work away from being predominately manual data based.

Given the nature of the role we require excellent knowledge of objective oriented languages such as JavaScript, Python, or C++. In addition, we require you to have a strong interest in terrorism, extremism and antisemitism.

Duties to include:

- To work with the Research Department to build technical solutions to problems facing staff
- To assist with the OSINT team monitoring for threats to the Jewish community
- Become proficient in and train colleagues in various OSINT tools
- To work collaboratively with colleagues in undertaking deeper investigations into various extremists' groups
- To support and assist with the wider department to produce regular reports
- When required to give presentations and briefings to external and internal stakeholders

The ideal candidate should have:

- Excellent technical problem-solving skills with a persistence to see issues resolved
- Excellent understanding of the threats affecting the Jewish community
- Proven interest in current affairs, counter terrorism and antisemitism
- Proactive and results orientated with the determination to see projects through from start to finish
- Customer orientated and understand the urgency to replying to requests in a timely manner
- Proven ability to work in a team
- Demonstrable presentation skills
- Strong team player
