This role is driven by a candidate who has a strong interest in topics related to antisemitism, extremism, radicalisation, and current affairs.

Your focus as a research analyst within OSINT (Open-Source Intelligence) hub is to contribute to ongoing online research to identify, investigate and understand extremism, terrorism, antisemitism, and threats to the Jewish community. You will have a passion for fighting antisemitism and extremism, as well as a commitment to ensuring that the UK Jewish community are able to live the Jewish lives that they so choose.

You should feel comfortable using and exploring the internet and social media for research purposes. A working knowledge of OSINT tools or techniques would also be an advantage.

Duties include

- To work closely with colleagues in the OSINT hub, and in other hubs within Policy and Defence, as well as the Security Department, to help protect the Jewish community against antisemitism and terrorism
- To explain and brief on a range of complex subjects and issues to colleagues and senior management within the organisation
- To engage with internal and external stakeholders and regularly deliver public presentations and talks
- To monitor, identify and research threats to the Jewish community
- To undertake deeper investigations into various extremist groups and work with the wider department to produce regular reports
- To become proficient in various Open-Source investigation tools and techniques
- To produce work that is consistently relevant and of use to the organisation

The ideal candidate should have

- An in-depth understanding of social media and trends online
- Excellent written and report writing skills and verbal communication skills
- Ability to work independently, take initiative and be a motivated self-starter
- The ability to create and deliver PowerPoint presentations
- Excellent team player
- Excellent understanding of the threats affecting the Jewish community
- Proven interest in current affairs, counter terrorism and antisemitism
