



CAMPUS RESEARCH & SECURITY OFFICER

Full-time, based in London

As the Campus Research & Security Officer you will be the expert on antisemitism on campus and in the student world. You will make sure, via the reports you write, presentations you provide and research you undertake, that CST has and maintains institutional knowledge and authority on this key area of communal concern.

You will also be responsible for supporting students who experience antisemitism or who report antisemitic incidents to CST. You will work closely with the National Student Security Co-ordinator as a core part of the CST Campus Team, wider Security team and colleagues in the organisation to deliver security for Jewish student communities across several campuses.

Duties include:

- To develop online tools and skills to assist you in your research work
- To write threat assessments for events being held on campus that relate to Jewish students
- To ensure that campus related antisemitic incidents are reported to CST and logged in our database
- To provide updates to senior CST staff regarding the situation of antisemitism on campus, and to present confidently to external partners
- To provide a conduit between campus partners and the CST campus team to source and share information relevant to antisemitism and security needs relating to campus – to hold and maintain a close working relationship with the Union of Jewish Students.
- Organising security for student events across various campuses
- Building up strong working relationships with Jewish societies and key personnel on university campuses across the UK.
- Providing support to students who have experienced antisemitism or reported antisemitic incidents

The ideal candidate should have:

- Excellent understanding of the threats affecting the Jewish community, antisemitism and what constitutes antisemitic discourse
- Strong communication skills, both verbal and written
- Excellent research skills and high proficiency with social media with demonstrable ability to research and interpret primary source data
- To have completed CST level 2 security officer training
- Good research skills
- Ability to work on own initiative and work independently, with regular supervision
- Ability to prioritise work accurately to strict deadlines, prioritise workload and work under pressure
